The level of hypnosis is (DEPEND) on both the experience of the hypnotist and the (EMOTION) condition of the subject. About twenty percent of subjects show (CAPABLE) of experiencing the deepest level of hypnosis. However, it is not necessary to reach the deepest state to achieve medical effects. Most hypnotist are (SUCCEED) in treating their patients at a light trance. Hypnotists believe they can treat both physical and psychological (ILL). Hypnosis can bring (RELIEVE) from certain pains and may constitute an (ADD) component in many therapies. Recently, doctors in France have proven (USE) of hypnosis as an alternative method of anesthesia during minor operations. Insomnia, bulimia, cigarette smoking and other (ADDICT) are the most frequent behavioural problems treated with hypnosis. Although the benefits hypnosis can bring have been demonstrated by a number of physicians and psychiatrists, it has not yet been fully accepted as a (RELY) method in modern medical practice.
